As I leave EMD Serono, I am grateful to have the opportunity to reflect on the successes and challenges our PAC has faced in my time as PAC Chair.

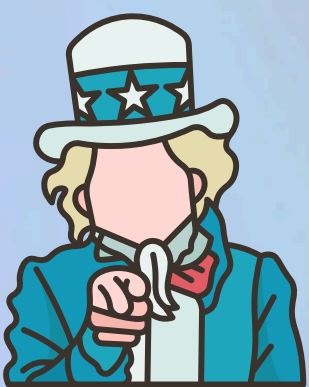

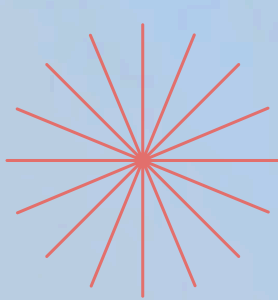
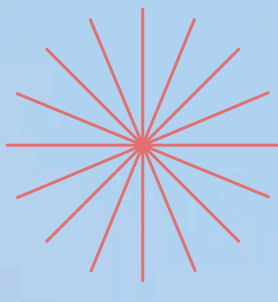

Federal law requires that EMD Serono PAC use its best efforts to collect and report the name, mailing address, occupation and name of employer of individuals whose contributions exceed \$200 in a calendar year.
